Completion of the full CSU or UC IGETC certification (CA), Washington and Oregon state-approved Direct Transfer degrees or other state's equivalent transfer certification prior to the student being admitted, enrolled and attending his/her first session in a bachelor's degree program at University of Massachusetts Global satisfies all University of Massachusetts Global General Education requirements except LBSU 302 & 304. Students who matriculate to University of Massachusetts Global with partial General Education certifications will have their coursework evaluated on a course by course basis to determine appropriate applicability to each general education category.

Lower division courses may be eligible to fulfill upper division major requirements if approved by the Dean of Arts and Sciences.

Degree Requirements & Concentrations/Electives

BA Liberal Studies consists of 9 credits in education foundations and 42 credits in subject matter courses to fulfill the 51 credit requirement for the program.

It is possible for transfer courses to meet course requirements within the emphasis area. That coursework must be reviewed by a dean within the School of Arts & Sciences to determine transferability.

***Minimum of 30 credits completed in residence at University of Massachusetts Global; 18 of which must be upper-division credits, 12 of which must be in the student's major.**
